
Welcome to The Housing Agency's Quarter 2 2024 Newsletter

Housing First Annual Conference

The Housing First Practitioners' Conference took place in Dublin Castle on 21st June 2024. The one-day event saw practitioners from all around the country come together to discuss the Housing First programme, its success and hear from Peer Support Specialists and Mentors.

Bob Jordan, CEO of The Housing Agency, officially opened the conference, highlighting some of the achievements of the programme since its inception. The programme has recently passed 1,000 tenants and there are now Housing First tenancies in every county in Ireland. Mr Jordan thanked attendees for their work with implementing the programme and highlighted the importance of having tenant voices in the room.

Rob Lowth, National Director of Housing First, highlighted the importance of partnership, collaboration and resilience in the sector.

Attendees heard from representatives from Social Farming Ireland about the benefits of their programme for Housing First participants. Aoife Wilmett, Occupational Therapist at the HSE, spoke about the benefits of incorporating occupational therapy into Housing First and community integration. Peter Brosnan from Sport Ireland spoke about their 'Sport4Empowerment' programme and the potential benefits of a partnership with Housing First.

Speakers from the HSE included Joe Kirby (Social Inclusion), Yvonne Cashman (Operational Lead) and Sinead Lawless (Social Worker). They spoke about the experience with Housing First and primary care in Cork and Kerry. They offered insights on how primary care can help with Housing First delivery, the Complex Case Management Team in Cork/Kerry, and provided a case

study of how a person had gone through the system with the Complex Case Management Team.

Dawn Russel from Ana Liffey Drug Project gave a macro view of addiction trends and supports across Ireland and spoke about the intersection between homelessness and addiction. Dr. Eileen Coroon Sweeney, Psychiatrist in the HSE Inclusion Mental Health Team, spoke about mental health pathways in the community, homeless mental health and the lessons learned from her experience in the sector.

Attendees heard from service users about their experiences in Cork and Sligo. Andrew Guy from The Housing Agency discussed the 'Assertive Street Outreach Good Practice Guide' and Tim Aubrey from the University of Ottawa and the Canadian Housing First Network provided an overview of fidelity assessment and Housing First.

The first webinar '*Housing Choices for a Sustainable Future*' took place on June 18^{th.} Speakers were Martin Colreavy, Senior Advisor, Strategic Delivery at the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, and Philip Comerford, Independent Architect at Philip Comerford Architects, Dublin.

The second webinar, '*Housing Children and Young People In Ireland*' took place on July 2nd. The webinar featured insights from Helen Russell, Head of the Social Research Division at the Economic and Social Research Institute (ESRI), and Sara Lannin, Research and Policy Officer at the Peter McVerry Trust (PMV). Housing Education Bursary Scheme 2024

The day itself included presentations from the Chair of the HAP Practitioners Committee, Chair of the HAP Place Finder Network, the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, The Housing Agency, The HAP Shared Service Centre, The Residential Tenancies Board and Threshold.

The event was well attended with 75 local authority HAP practitioners in attendance.



Multi-Unit Developments (MUDs)

International Conference

David Rouse, our Multi-Unit Developments Advisor, presented at the International Forum on Multi-Owned Properties, held in Tarragona, Spain 15-17 May.

The Forum brought together researchers from around the world to share work on multi-owned properties, including apartments, condominiums and homeowner associations.

The conference was organised by the City Futures Research Centre (University of New South Wales), and the UNESCO Housing Chair at the University Rovira i Virgili, Tarragona.

Webinar with Corporate Enforcement Authority

A live webinar about 'Owners' Management Companies and the role of the <u>Corporate Enforcement Authority</u> took place on Tuesday 16 April.

Some 380 people heard from Fallon Judge, Director of Civil Enforcement with the CEA, on company law matters for apartment owners' management companies.
