# Training Needs Assessment

The Housing Agency is committed to delivering highquality training for the Irish housing sector alongside our partners in the Housing Training Network. To enable us to continue providing training that meets the evolving needs of practitioners we conduct periodic Training Needs Analyses of the Irish housing sector.

We are pleased to launch our 2024 Training Needs Analysis survey. Building on previous analyses, this survey will allow us to update our training offerings for the period of 2024/25. Data will be collected anonymously and shared with our partners in the Housing Training Network.

# REPORT LAUNCH Housing Conditions for Older People

As Ireland's population ages, the issue of older people's housing has never been more important. A new report, **Housing Conditions and Integrated Care for Older People**, examined the links between common housing conditions and hazards and the health of older people. The project was funded by The Meath Foundation and involved a team from Tallaght University Hospital, Age Friendly Ireland, TrinityHaus and BRE who partnered with organisations including The Housing Agency, Age Action, South Dublin County Council, Meath County Council and the National Disability Authority.
