THE HOUSING AGENCY Research Support Programme

The Research Support Programme (RSP) is an important part of The Housing Agency's function to undertake and support independent research to inform housing policy development and good practice.

Since it was established in 2020, the RSP has funded 23 unique research projects on themes of affordability, cost rental housing, emergency accommodation, Modern Methods of Construction, social housing, sustainability, vacancy, and youth homelessness.

Projects are one year in duration and receive up to €30,000 in funding. Funding is available to researchers in Ireland and internationally.

Five reports were published in 2024 under the RSP and you can find these on our website here - <u>Research Support Programme</u>

An open call for applications to the RSP is carried out each year. Funding from the 2024 call was awarded to two projects, both of which commenced in January 2025.

- The Irish Green Building Council was awarded funding for their project, BIO-NEIGHBOUR, which will work to create simple, clear recommendations for scaling up nature-positive solutions in new Irish residential developments.
- The Local Government Information Unit was awarded funding to conduct an international comparative analysis of how local authorities measure and monitor the benefits of housing-based interventions to strengthen social cohesion.

The next call for the RSP is expected to go live on The Housing Agency's website in May 2025.

Profile of the Property Optimisation Unit (POU)

The Property Optimisation Unit (POU) is a team within the Housing Agency which supports local authorities to address vacancy within their areas.

The POU assist the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage in addressing vacancy through supports such as the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant, Repair and Lease Scheme, and guidance on Compulsory Purchase Orders and Compulsory Acquisition. The POU also assists members of the public with vacancy queries.

The team is most active in checking the charge documents on behalf of local authorities for the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant. This activity streamlines the legal process in relation to the grant which enables quicker drawdowns and reduces legal costs for local authorities. Each charge document must be thoroughly checked to review the verification of information, and additional documentation such as maps and / or land registry documents where applicable, before it can be returned to the local authority and applicants for signing.
